

RII30719 Certificate III in Emergency Response and Rescue

Cost: \$5,500 (deposit payment required upon booking of \$1,499).

Duration: 17 days (face-to-face) plus 1-6 months (online learning).

This course is designed to develop the skills of any persons wishing to excel in an Emergency Response Team (ERT) role. It is ideal for team members working within the mining, resources, and construction industries. This qualification is nationally recognised and is the mining and resources industry standard, and essential for those employed or seeking employment within firefighting or emergency response and rescue fields and to be part of an ERT.

Structure and Assessment Methods: This qualification is delivered through both theoretical and practical components. The units within this qualification are taught by our expert trainers who have current and up-to-date skills and knowledge in the fire and emergency response and rescue industries. This qualification includes a combination of online and self-paced completion of assessments, as well as face-to-face classroom-taught theory and practical scenarios.

Entry Requirements: Students must satisfy the following entry requirements to be permitted entry into this qualification.

- Provide a government-issued photo identification and valid USI.
- Complete Parabellum's Language, Literacy, Numeracy, and Digital Literacy (LLND) test.
- Complete Parabellum's Student Health and Fitness Declaration.

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- Possess approximately 12 months of relevant industry experience.
- Possess a laptop / tablet which can be brought to class.
- Be physically fit and able to carry a minimum of 20kgs in weight.
- Be clean shaven as per the requirements of AS1715.
- Be able to climb stairs and ladders whilst under load.
- Be able to manage feelings associated with a fear of heights.
- Be able to manage feelings associated with claustrophobia.
- Be able to communicate in a clear manner with others.
- Be able to read and record measurements.
- Be able to record information legibly.
- Be able to read and comply with work instructions and specifications.
- Possess the physical capacity to undertake the practical components of this qualification.
- Wear long pants, long-sleeved shirt, safety boots, safety glasses, and sun protection.

Pre-Requisites: All pre-requisite units of competency will be covered within each course and delivered in order of necessity, as to meet the following course's pre-requisite requirements.
